Conditions of Entry and Show Regulations

Exhibitors should read carefully the 'Conditions and Guidance' at the front and the 'Festival Regulations and Information' at the back of this schedule. Please Note: by making an entry, the exhibitor is making an agreement to comply with all Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural Society Conditions & Regulations.

Entry Closing Date: Friday 28th June 2024

Entries received after the closing date of entries cannot be accepted. Entries must be processed online or on paper and accompanied by the correct remittance.

Sheep Pens

Sheep pens must be booked with class entries at a cost of **£2 per pen**. The pens are 6ft x 6ft, therefore please carefully book your total requirements according to your needs. Entries will be called forward for judging from the pens so at least one pen must be booked per exhibitor. Classes are open to Non MV Scheme sheep only and will take place outside. Entries in one ownership will be accommodated in adjoining pens where possible.

Arrival & Departure Times

- The Livestock Gate (Coombs Road Gate) will open at 7am on Sunday 14th July
- Exhibitors will not be allowed onto the Showground before this time
- The gate will close at 6pm on Sunday 14th July (Festival closes 5pm)
- Sheep exhibitors must be on the Showground by 9:30am on Festival day. Please report to the livestock steward adjacent to the sheep pens and present relevant movement forms (you will be sent a map detailing the location of gates and pens closer to the event)
- Sheep may depart after 5pm on Festival day. Please note there is a strict No Vehicle Movement rule in place within the Festival event area between 10am and 5pm for health and safety reasons

Unloading & Parking

On arrival, all livestock vehicles will be met by a gate steward and advised where to unload. Exhibitors will have been issued with a map of the event prior to the day for reference. The area around the sheep pens must be kept clear to allow other exhibitors to unload safely. Exhibitors are advised to allow extra time for unloading due to other exhibitors and traders arriving. They will then be directed to the day parking area. To allow all exhibitors to unload and park safely, in a timely manner, please follow the instructions of the stewards.

Classes

Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural reserves the right to split or amalgamate classes once entries have closed and based on the numbers entered. Exhibitors will be notified before the show. In the event of there being fewer than 4 entries or 2 separate exhibitors received for any individual class, entries received will automatically be transferred to classes in the relevant 'Any Other' section.

Shelter

Please be advised that all pens are located outside and that exhibitors are advised to provide adequate shelter for sheep as this will not be provided.

Flock Name, Flock Number and Ear Tag Number

When completing entry forms, exhibitors must quote the flock name, flock number and all ear tag numbers.

Condition of Exhibit

All exhibits shall be marked, trimmed, unshorn, uncoloured etc. in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of their respective Breed Society, even if the exhibit is not a member of a Society. Any sheep found to be artificially coloured on the face, ear or leg or otherwise fake, with a view to deceiving the judges will be disqualified.

Scrapie

No segregation for Scrapie Monitored Negative Sheep is required providing all entries are (a) not pregnant, (b) have not lambed within 30 days of the Show and (c) not involved in artificial breeding procedures such as out of season lambing.

Sheep Scab

Exhibitors must comply with sheep scab regulations in force at the time of the Festival.

Docking

The Mutilation (Permitted Procedures) (England) Regulations 2007 Schedule 5.5. In all cases sheep must have enough of the tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of the male sheep. Any sheep which do not comply with the aforementioned legislation will not be eligible to be shown in the judging ring.

Vets on Call

The on-call vet for Bakewell Country Festival is Bakewell Vets (01629 812744). Bakewell Vets should be used for animals that are injured or showing signs of illness and disease.

Livestock Exhibitors Disease Control Obligations

The health of all animals and people present during Bakewell Country Festival is of paramount importance to the organisers. As such, we would like to remind livestock exhibitors of their responsibilities with respect to the health of their animals.

Only fit and healthy animals should be transported to the Festival. Any clinical signs of disease, however mild, detected on farm must result in the affected animal(s) remaining at home and not travelling to the Festival. This is the foundation on which high levels of Biosecurity can be built on at Bakewell Showground.

Once on the Showground, if any animals develop any signs of illness, one of the on-call veterinarians should be alerted immediately. If we all ensure only healthy animals arrive at Bakewell Country Festival and if any animal becomes sick at the Festival, prompt veterinary care must be sought to minimise the risk of:

- A Notifiable Disease Outbreak
- Zoonotic Infections passing from livestock to people.
- Endemic Veterinary Diseases spreading between pens/stalls. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

REGULATIONS & INFORMATION

Please observe the following for the smooth running of the Festival, your safety and the enjoyment of all who visit the Festival in any capacity.

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Responsibility

Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural Society shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever whilst entering on, or leaving the Society's premises, for any damage or loss, however caused to the property of such person, or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person. The Society shall not be responsible for any accident, damage, loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his employee or to any animal, article, or property brought into the showground, or whilst entering, or on leaving, or being carried into or out of the said showground. The exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury, or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought into the showground by him/her and he/she shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from all action, suits, expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.

2. Conduct of exhibitors and their employees

All persons in charge of stock will be subject to the orders of the Society's officials. Employees/Stockpersons must be in attendance during the Festival, at least half an hour prior to the time appointed for the examination, exhibition or parade of the animals in their charge. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees/stockpersons, and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees/stockpersons. Any fine imposed upon an exhibitor or his/her employee/stockperson for infringing the regulations, or disobedience to the order of the steward shall be recoverable from the exhibitor as a debt due to the Society, and until such fines be paid shall debar the exhibitor from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society.

3. Animal Welfare

Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.

ENTRIES

4. Entries will be accepted online and on paper.

- a. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fees.
- b. Information from entry forms will be stored on a computer and the name and details of entries will be published in the Catalogue unless otherwise advised to the Society.
- c. Information about exhibitors may also be passed to any regulatory authority such as DEFRA or Trading Standards as well as the Society's Veterinary Advisers.
- d. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

6. Substitution of entries

Substitution of entries will only be allowed in exceptional circumstances on production of a Veterinary Certificate for the animal being substituted and will be at the Festival organisers' discretion. There will be no refund of entry fees where substitutions are made.

7. Closing Date for entries in 2024

The closing date for entries is Friday 28th June 2024. Entries received after the closing date cannot be accepted.

8. Entry by minors

Entries by persons under 18 years of age shall be accepted only provided the rules and regulations of entry are agreed by the parent, guardian or trustee of the entrant.

9. Particulars of exhibits

For Jacob classes, full pedigree details must be given on the entry form. These details may be printed in the Festival catalogue. Every animal entered for the Jacob competition must be entered or certified as eligible for entry in the Herd/Flock Book of its breed in the U.K.

10. Breed Society/Governing Body Regulations

Any exhibitor competing under breed society or governing body affiliation will be considered to have agreed to abide by the rules of that society in addition to the Festival rules.

11. Age of exhibits

The year of birth of each exhibit must be stated on the entry form.

12. Right to reject entries

The Society reserves the sole right to reject or cancel the entry or entries made by a person, if it shall deem fit to do so, and right to cancel any class or classes, refunding any fees paid in respect thereof.

13. Cancellation of entries

Bakewell Country Festival reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class in the event of there being insufficient entries or exhibitors in the Class - details listed under each section, or to transfer entries to another Class.

14. Accuracy of catalogue

The Society will not be responsible for any inaccuracy in any pedigree or other particulars inserted in the catalogue, though every care will be made to ensure the accuracy of all particulars printed therein. The Society accepts no liability for incorrect details when entries are made online.

15. Refund of entry fees

Entry fees can be refunded only in the event of cancellation of classes or when an animal is incapacitated by accident, injury or illness. Applications for refunds must be made in writing to the Bakewell Country Festival Manager no later than 31 July 2024 and must be accompanied by a Veterinary Certificate dated before the Festival. Any claim received after 31 July 2024 will be invalid. Refunds will be processed after the Festival

TICKETS & PARKING

16. Tickets - exhibitors' passes

Each exhibitor will receive tickets in the form of wristbands as listed at the front of the schedule. Wristbands are complimentary and will be issued on arrival. Wristbands must be worn at all times when on the Showground.

17. Extra admission tickets

Extra exhibitor tickets may be purchased in advance through our online entry system for £13 each. Visit www.bakewellahs.co.uk. Additional tickets can be bought at the gates on Festival day at a cost of £16 each.

18. Vehicle Passes

Exhibitors will be issued with one complimentary vehicle pass on arrival; this pass will admit one vehicle and its trailer only. Please display passes visibly in your vehicle's windscreen.

19. Parking

On arrival please offload stock and park in the designated parking area, which stewards will direct you to. Vehicles will be required to be parked in the designated area and will not be permitted to return to the vicinity of the pens until 5pm, after the Festival closes to the public.

DISEASED ANIMALS

20. Animals suspected of, or suffering from disease

Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's Showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the Showground and, in addition, the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim.

The Society's on-call vets are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to, or have removed from, the Showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor of such animals may obtain a certificate from the Veterinary Officer, stating the nature of such disease or infection. The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.

21. Payment of prize money

Prize money will be paid in cash after each class has been judged.

JUDGING

22. Substitution of judges

The Society reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those announced in the Prize Schedule or to make other appointments.

HEALTH & SAFETY REGULATIONS

23. Smoking

Smoking is forbidden in livestock pens and judging rings including vapes/E-Cigarettes.

24. Control of livestock

Livestock must be under the control of a competent handler at all times, and they must use approved restraints which are safe and fit for purpose. Movements on the Showground include areas used by the public and from the livestock pens into the judging rings and handlers must ensure adequate safeguards are in place to prevent an animal from escaping.

25. Health and safety at work regulations

All exhibitors and their handlers must comply with the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974. Exhibitors are reminded that they are responsible for the observance, by themselves, their employees and their contractors, of all Health and Safety at Work Regulations. Any item of risk or hazard should be reported to the Chief Steward event HQ immediately.

INSURANCE

26. Public liability insurance

Exhibitors should ensure that they have appropriate public liability insurance cover (suggested minimum of £5 million).

GENERAL

27. DEFRA Regulations

Exhibitors must be aware of, and conform to, the regulations in place by DEFRA at all times.

28. Dogs/Pets

Dogs/pets are strictly not allowed in the livestock stalls and pens. In other areas of the Showground well behaved dogs/pets are permitted on fixed short leads only and must be friendly. Dogs are not to be left tied on leads in any areas on the Showground.

Any dogs showing aggressive behaviour will be asked to leave the Showground. No dogs are to be left unaccompanied in vehicles. If found, reasonable attempts will be made to rescue the dog. Please be a responsible dog owner and clean up after your dog.

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29. Fitness to Travel / Transport of Pregnant Animals

Animals must be fit for the intended journey prior to beginning the journey and must remain sufficiently fit throughout the travel period. This means the animal should be healthy enough to tolerate the entire journey it is about to make (including loading, unloading and any journey breaks) with no or very little adverse effect on it and the journey should not cause the animal any suffering or injury.

The means of transport must be designed, constructed, maintained and operated so as to avoid injury and suffering and ensure the safety of the animals. A journey includes the period from the loading of the first animal to the unloading of the last animal. Any animal entered in the Festival that is not fit to travel should be left at the holding premises.

The transport of pregnant animals for whom 90% or more of the expected gestation period has already passed, or who have given birth in the previous week is prohibited. Any animal entered to which these criteria apply should not be brought to the Festival under any circumstances. [Council Regulation (EC) 1/2005, implemented by The Welfare of Animals (Transport)(England) Order 2006].

30. Exhibit pens

Exhibitors and their employees must see that their exhibits are securely penned in the allotted place for them in accordance with their exhibit numbers. All mucking out must be completed before exhibitors leave the Showground.

31. Washing of stock

All stock should arrive at the Festival washed and ready to show.

32. Straw

A limited amount of straw is provided in the livestock pens.

33. Publicity

Exhibitors are allowed to promote their herd/flock with the use of signs which may not exceed 3' wide by 2' high per stall or pen. No promotional material may be placed in walkways.

34. First Aid

There is a designated Medical Centre on the Showground where First Aid will be available.

35. Cancellation or Termination of the Festival

If by reason of force majeure, severe adverse weather conditions, water-logged ground, failure or neglect on the part of any utility supplying electricity or water, labour strife, civil commotion, war (or threat thereof), act or threatened act of terrorism, fire or explosion or any other event beyond the control of the Society (other than a shortage of money or shortage of materials) the Society deems it necessary for it to cancel or terminate the holding of the Festival or any part of it, then the Society shall use its reasonable endeavours to ensure that the Exhibitor is made aware as soon as practicable of such cancellation or termination either in writing, by email, verbally by telephone or mobile, or by publication on the Society's website(s).

In the event of cancellation or termination pursuant to clause above, this Agreement shall determine automatically, and the Society shall repay to the Exhibitor all charges and fees already paid under this Agreement (if the Festival is cancelled before its commencement) or a rateable proportion of such charges and fees (if the Festival is terminated after its commencement) but otherwise shall be under no liability to the Exhibitor or its sub-licensees for any loss which they may sustain in consequence of any such determination and the Exhibitor shall in the event of determination be under no liability to the Society in respect of its future obligations under this agreement (but without prejudice to any rights of either party against the other in respect of any claim accrued under this Agreement down to the date of such determination).

36. Penalties

Any infringement of any of the regulations or conditions printed in this Schedule will result in the exhibitor forfeiting any prize to which he/she may be entitled in addition to the consequences attaching to the infringement and the Society reserves the right to inform other Agricultural Societies and bodies of any decision it may come to regarding an exhibitor.

37. Interpretation of Regulations

Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural Society reserves the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed regulations, conditions and prize lists, and to settle arbitrarily and determine all matters, questions or difference in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with incident to the Festival. Also, to substitute Judges, refuse and to cancel entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, vary or cancel awards of prizes or reserve numbers and relax conditions as the Society may deem necessary.

38. Statement

All exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to the rules, orders and regulations of the Council of Bakewell Agricultural & Horticultural Society. The Organisers of this Festival have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. In order for these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers, and of all Officials and Stewards.
